FORBIDDEN USE OF ELECTRIC MOBILITY DEVICES (EMDs) ON CAMPUS

Electric mobility devices (EMDs), including electric scooters, electric unicycles, electric hoverboards, electric skateboards, and electric bicycles, have gained popularity in recent years, especially for short-distance travel. However, while these devices offer a modern alternative for getting around, they also pose unique safety hazards. Issues related to battery quality can lead to dangerous situations, such as overheating or leakage during charging, which create serious fire risks. Additionally, the presence of EMDs in pedestrian areas and roads can endanger both drivers and pedestrians, increasing the potential for accidents.

According to the Transport Department, the use of EMDs is currently **ILLEGAL**. Therefore, operating these devices on campus violates local regulations.
